 and the Acts so provided for the Establishing of
 Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
 according to the Directions of said Acts, and according
 to equity and good Conscience and without favour or
 affection prejudice or malice to any persons or
 persons whatsoever.

And we do further swear that
 we and each of us are possessed of a clear personal
 Estate of One thousand pounds over and above
 all our just Debts and Incumbrances.

 Tatham Codrington as Composition for the
 Tithes claimable by him as Clerical
 Incumbent of said Parish.

And we do further certify that the
 Average price of Wheat being the corn principally
 grown in this County for the period of Seven
 years ending on the first Day of November
 One thousand Eight hundred and Twenty
 is One pound fifteen Shillings and Eight
 pence Half penny of Ireland.
