 good Conscience and without favour or affection
 prejudice or malice to any person or persons
 Whomsoever.

And we do further Swear that we
 and each of us are possessed of a clear personal
 Estate and property of one thousand pounds over
 and above all our just Debts and Incumbrances

 James Gray Commissioners duly appointed and Sworn under
 and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the
 Reign of King George the fourth Entitled An Act to
 provide for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in
 Ireland for a limited time to ascertain any five a true
 and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing
 payable within the Parish of Killelan in
 the County of Wick

We hereby certify that the true and just
 amount of Composition for all Tithes whatsover
 within the said Parish is two hundred and
 Seventeen pounds ten Shillings by the year of
 which sum of two hundred and Seventeen pounds
 ten Shillings, one third part is due and payable
 to the Rev^d Latham Coddington as composition
 for the Tithes claimable by him as Clerical
 Incumbent of said Parish and two thirds
 is due and payable to Sir Richard Steele Baront
 as Owner of said two thirds.

And we do further certify that the
 average price of Wheat the most principally
 grown in this County for the space of Seven
 years ending on the first day of November
 one thousand eight hundred and Twenty one
 is one pound fifteen Shillings and Eight pence
 Halfpenny per Barrel.
