

I Laurence Lloyd Henry Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth intituled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth, fifth & in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishing of compositions for tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent,---- To ascertain and fix a true and just composition, for all tithes arising, growing yielded ^{or payable} within the Parish of Tymool, in the County of Meath,--- do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes whatever within the said Parish is Seventy seven pounds Sterl. by the year, of which sum of Seventy seven pounds, Forty five pounds, are due and payable to the Rev. Edward Batty as Vicar of said Parish,-- and Thirty two pounds, are due and payable to Thomas Hamilton Esq^r as Lay Impropriator of said Parish,--- The vicar is entitled to the tithe of the Hay, and to one third of the tithe of the corn,-- The Lay Impropriator being entitled to two thirds of the tithe of corn,--- and I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such county for the period of seven years ending the first day of November 1830 is Fifty two shillings and one half penny per barrel-----
