

I Stephen H. Atkins Esq^r a Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the Fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth intituled an act to provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, and under, and by virtue of the several acts amending the same, and passed in the Fifth, Seventh, and Eighth years of the reign of King George the Fourth, and under, and by virtue of an act passed in the second, and third years of his present Majesty King William the Fourth: intituled an act to amend the three acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, Seventh and eighth years of his late Majesty King George the Fourth, providing for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such permanent, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing yielded, or payable within the Parish of Porter in the county of Wexford; do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is three hundred pounds by the year, which said sum of three hundred pounds by the year is due and payable to Cesar Colclough Esq^r as lay impropriator of said Parish, and I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in such county for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November 1830 is one pound twelve shillings and one halfpenny per barrel
