permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all tithes arising growing yielding and payable within
the parish of Tins Coffin in the County of Kilkenny, do
hereby certify that the true and just amount of
Composition for all tithes whatever within the said
Parish is one hundred and eighty five pounds by the
year which sum is due and payable to The Rev^d Robt
Sanderson as rector of said parish as a composition
for all tithes claimed by him within said Parish

I do hereby further certify that the average price
of wheat being the Principal Corn grown in such
County for the period of seven years ending the
First day of November one Thousand Eight hundred
and Thirty is one pound twelve shillings and one
half penny per barrel
