

Received in the Registry of the Diocese of Osnay the 16th October 1833

I Patrick Niwau Commoner duly appointed
and sworn under and by Statute of an Act made
in the second and third year of the reign of
King William the fourth entitled an Act to amend
the Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth
and in the seventh and eighth year of the reign
of his late Majesty King George the fourth
providing for the establishing of compensation for
Tithes ^{&c} in Ireland and to make such compensation
permanent to ascertain and see a true and
just compensation for all Tithes arising
growing yielding or payable within the Parish of
Liscoppin in the County of Wexford

I do hereby certify that the true and just
amount of compensation for all Tithes whatever
within the said Parish is Two Hundred and Ninety Pounds
Shillings and three Pence Sterling by the year of which
sum is due and payable to the Rev. Robert Anderson
Rector thereof and I do further certify that the average
price of wheat being the Corn principally grown
in this County for the period of seven years ending
on the first day of November English Rente
and thirty is one Pound Ten Shillings and ten
Pence Sterling per Bush Given under My hand
