

Received for the Lord Bishop of Jersey the 16th October 1833

I Patrick Nicewan Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in
the second and third year of the reign of King
William the fourth entitled an Act to amend
the Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and
in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of
his late Majesty King George the fourth
Providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland and to make Compositions pursuant to
assent and for a true and just Compositions for
all Tithes arising growing growing or payable
within the Parish of St. Asaph in the County of
of Meath. I do hereby certify that the true
and just amount of Compositions for all
Tithes whatever within said Parish is Two Hundred
and Nine Pence four Shillings and three
Pence Halfpenny by the year of which Tithes
is due and payable to the Reverend Robert
Saunderson Rector thereof and I do further
certify that the average price of corn
wheat being the commonest grown in
the County for the period of seven years ending
on the first day of November Eighteen Hundred
and thirty is one Pound Ten Shillings and three
pence Given under my hand this 15th day
of Oct. 1833
