

We the undersigned Joseph Bradshaw and Thomas Hunt Commissioners appointed under the 3<sup>rd</sup> of the composition Act find the Parish of Foom in the County of Tipperary to contain by our Survey and valuation thereof 7420 acres and 24 perches Irish plantation Measure of which we find that 477 acres 2 Roods 36 perches maketh 1<sup>st</sup> Class or quality are worth £ 1. 16. 11. British per acre shall pay the sum of 1. 6. British per Acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof and we find that 1428 acres 3 Roods and 12 perches maketh second Class or quality are worth £ 1. 7. 8. British per acre shall pay the sum of 1. 0. 4. British per acre as a composition for the Tythes thereof and so in proportion for Roods and perches. and we find that 1094 acres 3 Roods 9 perches maketh third Class or quality are worth £ 0. 18. 5. British per acre shall pay the sum of 0. 8. British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof. and we find that 399 acres maketh fourth class or quality worth £ 0. 9. 2. British per acre shall pay the sum of 5. pence British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof. and we find that 3553 acres 3 Roods 7 perches maketh fifth quality worth 4. 4. British per acre and so in proportion for Roods and perches as a composition for the Tythes thereof. and finally we find that the above mentioned sums payable out of the above mentioned qualities of Land make the sum of £ 215. 8. 4.
