of Tithe Rent Charge payable  
out of the parish of Trivet  
in said County of Meath

By the Justice of the Peace  
at the Quarter Sessions  
of the peace holden on the  
twenty-second day of October  
in the year of our Lord 1840

Whereas it appeared to us  
the said Justices that on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of October in the year of  
our Lord 1840 aforesaid and in the 7<sup>th</sup> year next  
after the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1833 on which day  
the original composition for the Tithes of the said  
Parish of Trivet, commenced, a notice in writing  
signed by Matthew Elias Corbally, Thomas Maher  
Christopher Broony and several other persons  
being each liable to and charged with the annual  
payment of £ 3 and upwards in respect of  
rent charges payable in lieu of such composition,  
hereinbefore mentioned and of Lands situated in said  
Parish of Trivet whereof said persons are Landlords  
or owners affixed and given within the said Parish  
signifying the intention of the said Persons to make  
application at these present Quarter Sessions  
pursuant to the statutes in such case made and  
provided to have the average price of Wheat (being  
the species of Grain mentioned in the original  
Certificate of the Composition for the Tithes of the  
said Parish as the measure of such Composition)  
for the 7 years preceding ascertained from the Dublin  
Gazette for the purpose of having the amount of  
said composition varied pursuant to the statutes  
in such case made and provided and the said  
application having pursuant to the Notice aforesaid  
been duly made by the persons aforesaid for the  
purpose aforesaid to us the Justices aforesaid now
