

I James Braxington Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an act passed in the second and third years of the reign of King William the 4th intituled an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the 4th 5th and in the 7th and 8th years of the reign of King George the fourth providing for the Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising growing yielded and payable within the parish of Trevis in the County of Meath do hereby Certify that the true and just Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One hundred and Sixty Six pounds Seventeen Shillings and Six pence being the average of the Tithes paid within said Parish for the Seven Years ending November 1830 and a further sum of Thirty Three Pounds Seven Shillings and Six pence being an addition of One fifth of the average which am empowered to make under 16th Sect. George 4th Chap: 99 which addition I consider to be just and equitable in consequence of the diminution of Tithes received within the period prescribed by Law namely from November 1824 to November 1830 which diminution was caused from irritable feelings being excited between the Incumbent of the Parish and the Land Owners, which induced the Tithes payers to cease to grow upon their farms Tithable Commodities,
