I John Collins, Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under
and by virtue of an Act made in the 2^d & 3^d year of the reign of King
William the 4th entitled an Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively
in the 1st, 5th and in the 7th & 8th years of the reign of his late Majesty
King George the 4th providing for the establishing of Composition
for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent
to ascertain and fix a true and Just Composition for All Tithes
arising, growing, yielding or payable within the Parish of Tubbruffin in the
County of Wicklow, Do hereby Certify, that the true and Just amount
of Composition for All Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish
is Two hundred and Fifty Pounds Sterling out of which the sum
of Eighty Three Pounds Six Shillings and Eight Pence, is due and payable
to the Reverend Luke Fowler as a Composition for the Vicarial Tithes
of All said Parish claimable by him as Vicar thereof, for his one third
of said £250 Sterling, And that the sum of One hundred and Sixty
Six Pounds, thirteen Shillings and Four Pence, being the remaining Two
thirds of said Sum of £250 Sterling is due and payable to the
Mayor and Citizens of the Corporation of Wicklow as Owners
and Appropriators of the Rectorial or said Two Third Parts of
the whole of said Tithes of said Parish.

And I Do further Certify that the average Price
of Wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for the
Period of Seven years ending on the first of November 1830 is Thirty
Two Shillings and One half penny per Barrell.
