

Certificate of Composition for all Tithes in
the Parish of Grove in the Diocese of Epsom

We John Wood of Somerset and James Hayden
of Cheshire in the County of Wiltshire Commissioners
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an
act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George
the fourth, intituled an Act to provide for the establish-
ment of Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a
limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just
composition for all tithes arising growing yielded
or payable within the parish of Grove in the Diocese
of Epsom and County of Wiltshire. Do Certify that
the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatsoever within the said Parish is Two hundred and
thirtytwo pounds ten Shillings by the year, of which
Sum of Two hundred and thirtytwo pounds ten shillings
two third parts are due and payable to the Vicar Choral
of Christ's Church Dublin, or their Successors, as a composition
for the tithes, claimable by them as owners of the Rectorial tithes,
and one third part is due and payable to the Reverend John
Hayden as Vicar of the Vicarial tithes of the said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the average price
of wheat being the corn principally grown in the Coun-
ty of Wiltshire for the period of seven years ending
the first of November 1828 is one pound eighteen shillings
and eight pence farthings.
