

Certificate of Composition for all Tithes in the
Parish of Grove in the Diocese of Ossory.

We John Wood of Smerston and James Hayden of
Caherlish in the County of Wicklow Commissioners duly ap-
pointed and sworn under and by Virtue of an Act made in the
fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth entitled an
Act to provide for the establishment of Composition for Tithes in
Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a true and
just Composition for all Tithes arising growing, yielded or
payable within the Parish of Grove in the Diocese of Ossory
and County of Wicklow do Certify that the true and just
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the
said Parish is Two hundred and thirty two pounds
ten Shillings by the year of which sum of Two hundred
and thirty two pounds ten Shillings two third parts are
due and payable to the Vicars Choral of Christ's Church
Dublin or their Successors as a Composition for the Tithe
claimable by them as Owners of the Rectorial Tithe, and
one third part is due and payable to the Reverend John
Keamey as Curate of the Vicarial Tithes of the said Parish.

And we do further Certify that the average
price of wheat being the Corn principally grown in the
County of Wicklow for the period of seven years ending
the first of November 1821 is One pound eighteen Shillings
and eight pence per Barrel.
