

We William Palmer and John Rotke Esquires Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act  
made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the  
fourth, intituled "An Act to provide for the establishing of  
Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to as-  
certain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes  
arising, growing, yielding, or payable within the Parish of  
Tallow in the County of Dublin do hereby certify that  
the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes  
whatever within the said Parish of Tallow is Three hun-  
dred and sixteen pounds four Shillings and Six pence by  
the year, of which sum of Three hundred and sixteen  
pounds four shillings and six pence, Two third parts namely  
Two hundred and ten pounds sixteen shillings and four  
pence are due and payable to the Most Honble and Right Revd.  
Charles Lord Bishop of Kildare as a Composition for the Tithe  
claimable by him as Dean of Christ Church Dublin, and  
one third part namely One hundred and five Pounds eight  
Shillings and two pence is due and payable to the Revd.  
Charles Stridley Clark as a Composition for the tithe claim-  
able by him as Perpetual Curate of the said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average Price of wheat  
being the Corn principally grown in such County, for the period  
of seven years ending on the first day of November  
1821 pursuant to a Schedule per Barrel  
furnished by the Right Honble Henry Goulburn  
Chief Secretary to the Right Lord Lieutenant of  
Ireland is One Pound eighteen shillings and eight pence  
half penny per Barrel — William Palmer
