I the Reverend Cornelius Henry Tupper Doctor in Divinity, Incumbent
of the United Parishes of Sully (alias Sullyferne) and Aghnisk
commonly called Sullyaughnisk, in the Diocese of Raphoe and
County of Donegal, do hereby certify that I have received from Thomas
Brooke Esq: of Lough Lesh, in said County, the Chief Landlord or
Leasee seized in Fee simple of the Messuages and Reversion of all that
and those, the Town lands and premises with their subdivisions
of Shillydonnell and Shillygreen, also the Town and lands of Glenkeen,
all situate lying or being within the United Parishes of Sully (alias
Sullyferne) and Aghnisk commonly called Sullyaughnisk in the
Diocese of Raphoe and County of Donegal, a Notice in the words and
figures following; Viz Pursuant to the Provisions of the Statute made
and passed in the 2^d and 5^d years of the Reign of his present
Majesty King William the 4th entitled "An Act to amend three
Acts passed respectively in the 4th and 5th and in the 7th and 8th
years of the reign of his late Majesty, King George the 4th providing
for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland, and to
make such Compositions permanent;" and of one other Statute
made and passed in the 3^d and 4th years of the Reign of his present
Majesty King William the 4th entitled "An Act for the Relief of the
Honors of Tithes in Ireland" - And for the Amendment of the above
recited Act of the 2^d and 3^d years of the Reign of his present Majesty,
I hereby give you Notice, that I am desirous to agree for and to
undertake, as provided by the said Acts (upon your performing
the Matters and Things, prescribed and enacted by the said
Acts to be done and performed on your part) the future payment
of the Tithes Compositions, charged upon, and payable and payable out
of the Townlands and premises, herein after particularly described
and mentioned, with their Subdivisions, situate, lying
and being within the United Parishes of Sully and Aghnisk
commonly called Sullyaughnisk, in the County of Donegal; that
is to say the Town and Lands of Shillydonnell and Shillygreen,
bounded on the South by Carrycastle - West by Burnsides - North by
Ballyally; and East by Fort Stewart; also the Town and lands of Glenkeen
bounded
