

We Sir John Burke Bart & Sir Malachi Burke Esq<sup>r</sup> Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and  
by virtue of an act made in the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the reign of King George the 4<sup>th</sup> intitled an act to provide for the  
Establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition  
for all tithes whatever arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Tyreah in the County of Galway  
do hereby certify that the true & just amount of composition for all tithes shewn in said Parish is two hundred  
and sixty eight pounds six shillings & eight pence <sup>11</sup> by the year, thereof two hundred & ~~sixty eight~~ <sup>thirty six</sup> pounds  
~~six~~ <sup>five</sup> shillings & ~~eight~~ <sup>four</sup> pence is due & payable to the Revd James Francis Keenan Rector of St. Andrew's - thirty six  
pounds one shilling & four pence is due & payable to the Revd Bishop of Clogher, as his Lordship's Vicar -  
two pounds are due & payable by the year to the Vicar General of Christ Church Dublin and fifteen pounds  
are due and payable by the year to the Revd & the Hon<sup>ble</sup> Maurice Graham as Prebendary of Kilmoree - and we do  
hereby certify that the average Price of oats, being the Corn principally grown in such County for the period  
of seven years ending the first of November 1821 twenty one is thirteen shillings & six pence <sup>per bush</sup>.
