The Establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and
just composition for all Tithes whatever arising growing yielding or payable within the Parish of Tyrnagh in the
County of Galway do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever
in said Parish is Two Hundred and Sixty Eight pounds Six Shillings and Eight pence Sterling by the year,
Whereof Two Hundred and fifteen pounds five Shillings and four pence Sterling is due and payable to the Reverend
James Strange Rector of said Parish Thirty six pounds one Shilling and four pence is due and
payable to the Lord Bishop of Clonfert as his Lordships proportion, two pounds are due and payable to the
Vicar Choral of Christ Church Dublin and fifteen pounds are due and payable by the year to the Honble and
Rev. Maurice Mahon as prebendary of Kilmeen and we do hereby certify that the average price of Oats being
the Corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending the first of November 1821
Twenty one is Three Shillings and Six pence per Barrel
