Lauder, Commissioners, duly appointed &  
sworn (under & by virtue) of an act made in  
the fourth Year of the Reign of King George the IV,  
entitled an act to provide for the Establishing  
Composition for Tithes in Ireland for a limited  
time) to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition  
for all Tithes growing arising due or payable  
within the Parish of <sup>Marion</sup> Herbane in the Kings County  
do hereby Certify that the sum of Three Hundred  
Pounds agreed on as an Annual Composition  
between the Incumbent and proprietors of Tithes  
in S<sup>d</sup> Parish and at the Special Certify held therein  
on the 17<sup>th</sup> day of November 1823 pursuant to the  
provisions of S<sup>d</sup> Act - Is a just and true Composition  
for all Tithes whatever, within said Parish, and  
that the S<sup>d</sup> sum of £300 Is. not under the average  
Receipts of Tithes paid or payable in said Parish  
during the 7 Years preceding & ending the 1<sup>st</sup> November  
1821 and we also Certify that £150 of S<sup>d</sup> £300 Is. due  
& payable to the Rev. Henry Mahon, as Vicar of  
S<sup>d</sup> Parish, £75 to Edmund Armstrong as Lessee  
of Tithes & £75 to the Rev. Henry King as an  
Proprietor of Tithes in said Parish
