the County of Kilkenny do hereby certify, that the true and just
 amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said
 Parish is two hundred and twenty one pounds sterling by the year
 of which sum of two hundred and twenty one pounds two third
 parts amounting to one hundred and forty seven pounds six shillings
 and eight pence are due and payable to the Rev. Mr. Maunsell as
 a composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector of the said
 Parish and one third part amounting to seventy three pounds
three shillings and four pence is due and payable to the said
 Rev. Thomas Maunsell the Vicar of the said Parish
 And we do further certify, that the average price of wheat
