At a Special Vestry under the Tithe  
Composition act of which legal notice  
was given, held in the Parish Church of  
Castlane, alias Whitechurch on Monday the  
7<sup>th</sup> day of May 1827 to take into consideration  
the Certificate of the Commissioners for fixing  
the amount of the Composition for the  
Tithes of the said Parish of Castlane alias  
Whitechurch - it was then and there resolved  
that the sum of Two hundred and twenty one  
pounds ster<sup>o</sup> therein stated as the amount of  
the Composition for all Tithes whatever within

a Parish by the year shall be invariable for the  
Term of Twenty one years from the first day of May  
One thousand eight hundred and twenty seven being  
the first day of May ensuing the date of said  
Certificate and that such composition shall continue  
to be levied for such Term of Twenty one years and  
shall not be subject to any variation in the amount  
thereof during such Period of Twenty one years, whatever  
the Price of corn may be -
