

And whereas the said Commission is duly appointed and sworn in and by
virtue of an Act made in the 2nd & 3rd years of the Reign of his
said Majesty King William the Fourth, entitled an Act to amend
three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in the
Sixth and Eighth years of the Reign of his late Majesty King
George the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent
and to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of White-
church, Glynn and County of Wicklow, do hereby certify that the
true and just amount of Compositions for all Tithes whatever within
said Parish consisting of the following Townlands, Bannock, Blackhall,
Milbrook, Davidstown and Richard, Muckinstown, Cullin, Bays town,
Upper Bays town, Lambstown, Ballinacloy, Ballypearce, Ballyquin and Corlican
and part of the Townland of Dungee is Two Hundred and Sixty pounds
one Shilling and three half pence by the year, of which Sum of
Two Hundred and Sixty pounds one Shilling and three half pence
the Sum of Two Hundred and fourteen pounds thirteen Shillings
and nine pence is due and payable to the Rev. John Brooke
as Incumbent Curate of said Parish and the Sum of Forty five
pounds seven Shillings and four pence half penny is due and
payable to the Earl of Portsmouth, as Lay Rector of the
Parish of Whitechurch. And I do further certify that the average price of oats
being the Commodity given in said County for the period of
seven years ending 1st November 1830 is 12:11¹/₂ pence
