

Whereas Lefter, A. Bryan, Esq., of the City of Dublin, has served me, John
Booker, Incumbent of the Parish of Whitechurch Glynn, with a notice in writing, in the
words following, "Sir, you are hereby required to take notice, that in pursuance of an
act passed in the 2^d year of his present Majesty, entitled, "An act to amend three acts
passed respectively in the 5th, and in the 7th & 8th years of the reign of his late Majesty,
King George the 4th, providing for the establishing of Compositions for tithes in Ireland,
and to make such compositions permanent," I, Lefter, A. Bryan, of Brideshead,
in the County of the City of Dublin, being possessed in fee of all that and these the
lands of Davidstown and Rahard, situate in the parish of Whitechurch Glynn,
Barony of Bantley, and County of Wicklow, or otherwise entitled, according to the
provisions of said act, to agree for and undertake the payment of the composition for
tithe, lawfully payable for and in respect of such lands, do hereby signify to you
my desire to agree for and undertake the future payment of such composition as
aforesaid, for and in respect of the said lands, and thereby require you to grant
me a certificate, in writing conformable to the provisions of said act, declaring
me entitled to the benefit of this notice, and to perform the other matters
in your part required by the said act to be done
