Whereas on the Twenty Sixth Day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty four a Certificate for the Parish of Whitechurch in the Diocese of Ferns in Ireland was lodged with the Registrar of the Bishop of the said Diocese and now appears and is entered and recorded in the Registry of the said Diocese in the Words and Figures here following to wit

"We Jacob W Goff and Nicholas Lett Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the 4th year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intituled An Act to provide for the Establishing of Composition of Tythes in Ireland for a limited Time to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tythes arising growing yielded and payable within the Parish of Whitechurch in the County of Wexford DO hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tythes whatever within the said Parish is four hundred and thirty two Pounds 2 7 1/2 p by the year which Sum of £432^{..}2^{..}1² p is due and payable to the Reverend Thomas Sandcock aforesaid as Rector of the Parish of Whitechurch and we further Certify that the Average Price of Oats being the Corn principally grown in the said County for the Period of seven Years ending on the 1st Day of November 1821 is 15 1/2 1/4 per Barrell Given under our Hands this 24 Day of March 1824
