Under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and  
third year, of the Reign of King William the Fourth  
Chap. 119 - Intituled an Act to amend three acts passed  
respectively, in the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and  
Eighth years, of the Reign of his late Majesty King George  
the Fourth, providing for the Establishing of Compositions  
for Tithes, in Ireland and to make such Compositions  
permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just  
Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or  
payable, within the Parish of Younghal, in the County of  
Cork - Do hereby Certify that the true and just amount  
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said  
Parish, is Five Hundred, and twenty one Pounds, three  
Shillings, and three pence sterling, by the year -

Which Sum of Five Hundred, and twenty one  
Pounds, Three Shillings, and three pence, is due  
And payable to the Reverend James Kingston as a  
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as Rector  
of the said Parish - And I do further Certify, that the  
Average Price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown  
in such County, for the Period of seven years ending the  
first day of November 1830, is One Pound, twelve shillings,  
And one half penny <sup>per</sup> barrel -
