Mr Knose having shortly after ceased to act as agent to the Commissioners the subject was frequently under consideration no further information was obtained calculated to remove the difficulty which existed - In the year 1854 Mr Gannett, Mr Knose's Successor in the Agency renewed the Investigation and in November 1854 reported the result of his inquiries as follows,

Dear Sir / Relative to the apportionment of the rent charge of the above property. I beg to report for the information of the Board, that I have been unable to attach the liability for any portion of it on the persons in whose possession it is, The reason of this is the impossibility which exists of ascertaining the locality of the several holdings as apportioned as well as also the boundaries of the several allotments made to each Proprietor, all the old boundaries as described in the award of the Commissioners for enclosing the Commons dated 1834 being either defaced or not now to be recognized and all the holdings as apportioned in the year 1829 being long since changed and their localities unknown -

It being therefore equally as impossible to identify the several allotments with the holdings in the apportionment Book, as to identify the existing holdings with the apportionment Book, I have to report that it
