October 1833

I William Figgis Commissioner duly appointed and Sworn  
under and by Virtue of an Act made in the second and third  
years of the reign of King William the fourth entitled an Act  
to amend three Acts pass'd respectively in the Fourth, Fifth,  
Seventh and Eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King  
George the Fourth providing for the establishing of composition  
for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such compositions permanent  
and to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all  
Tithes arising, growing, yielding, or payable within the Parish  
of Urlingford in the County of Kilkenny do hereby Certify that the  
true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever  
within the said Parish is One Hundred & Fifty Pounds Sterling  
by the year which sum of One Hundred and Fifty Pounds Sterling  
is due and payable to the Honorable and Very Rev<sup>d</sup> Joseph Bourke  
Dean of Ossory, the Rector and Vicar of the said Parish as a  
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as <sup>such</sup> Rector & Vicar

And I do hereby further Certify that the average price  
of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of No-  
vember 1830, thirty, is one Pound, twelve shillings per Barrel,
