October 1833

I William Figgis Commissioner duly appointed and sworn  
under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and  
third years of the reign of King William the fourth entitled  
an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth  
Fifth, seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late  
Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing  
of composition for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such  
Compositions permanent and to ascertain and fix a true and  
just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielding or  
payable within the Parish of Arlingford in the County of Kil-  
=Kenny do hereby Certify that the true and just amount of  
Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish  
is One Hundred & Fifty Pounds Sterling, by the year,  
which sum of One Hundred & Fifty Pounds Sterling is due  
and payable to the Honorable and Very Rev<sup>d</sup> Joseph Burke  
Dean of Ossory, the Rector & Vicar of the said Parish as a  
Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as such Rector  
and Vicar, And I do further Certify that the average price  
of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in such County  
for the period of seven years, ending on the first day of  
November 1830 thirty is One Pound, Twelve Shillings and one  
halfpenny per barrel,
