We Henry Leslie Prentice of the City and County of Antrim and William Walker of Killcadden in the County of Donegal, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the reign of King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" do hereby certify ~~copy~~ that at a Special Vestry held according to the provisions of said Act in the parish Church of Urney on the twenty fifth day of May last it was then and there agreed upon by the Parson James Jones, Rector of said Parish (he having first obtained the consent of the Right Reverend William Knox Lord Bishop of the Diocese in which said Parish is situated) and the parishioners then and there assembled - That the fixed yearly sum of Seven Hundred pounds Sterling British Currency be the true and just Amount of Compositions for all Tithes arising growing yielding or payable within the said Parish of Urney, in the Counties of Tyrone and Donegal to the Rector thereof, exclusive of the Glebe Lands and the Demesne attached to the Glebe House of Urney.

And it was further agreed upon that such Composition shall be invariable for the term of Twenty one Years from the first day of November next ensuing the date hereof, and that such Composition shall continue to be lived for such Term of Twenty one Years according to our appointment thereof, and shall not be subject to any variation in the amount thereof during such period of Twenty one Years under the provisions of said Act whatever the price of Corn may be. Given under our hands this 14th day of October 1826.
