

We the Reverend Archdeacon Butson of Clonfert House, and Peter Geohagan of Kilk County Galway Esq: Commissioners appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth intitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kiltormer in the County of Galway. Do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred and Ten Pounds per annum by the year — Of which sum of One Hundred and Ten Pounds, Thirty Five Pounds is due and payable to the Reverend Edward Hartigan, as Vicar of the said Parish; Thirty Pounds is due and payable to the Very Rev: Thomas Hawkins as Dean of Clonfert, and Forty Five Pounds 10s: is due and payable to the Bishops of the Dioc: of Clonfert —

We do further certify that the average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in such County for the period ending the First of November 1821 (Twenty One) is Ten Shillings and Six pence by the barrel — Given under our hands and seals this Twentieth day of October, in the year of OUR LORD, One thousand, eight hundred, and Twenty Three.
