I cannot conceive how my Estates in  
Ballymore can be divided into two Town-lands  
with 265<sup>Ac. 0. 8</sup> of Land payable for by the composi-  
tion Rent - The entire two Town-lands contain  
by a Survey lately made by Mr W. F. Jackson  
265<sup>Ac. 0. 8</sup> And there must be at least the two lines  
and extra Berches (if not more) in those lines  
of Roads running through these farms -  
The first a very long line from Ballycanue  
to the Corries of Ballymore - Along Ballycanue and  
the other half on - Ballydoff & Ballyjin - 1<sup>o</sup> Mr Norin<sup>ites</sup>  
The second nearly the same length in the front  
of the Hill from Ballycanue which meets the above  
The third from the cross Gate to the Hill  
meeting the latter - Both these are entirely on the  
Lands -

You ought long since have sent me a state-  
ment of the contents chargeable with by the  
rent and what each division in the hands of  
the occupants are subject to from the valuations  
books - otherwise it is impossible for me to  
know what charge is to be made on the occupants  
separately - you of course will send me a
