

We, Gilbert Conry and Nicholas Mahon James Corninippers duly  
appointed & sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the 4<sup>th</sup>  
Year of the Reign of King George the fourth entitled "An Act to  
provide for the establishing of compositions for Tithes in Ireland for  
a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for  
all Tithes whosoever arising growing yielded or Payable within the  
Parish of Kellinstan in the County of Roscommon, do hereby certify, that the true  
and just Amount of Composition for all Tithes within the sd Parish is  
Three hundred & Twelve Pounds <sup>per Annum</sup> ~~sterling~~ by the year, of which Sum of Three hundred  
and Twelve Pounds <sup>sterling</sup> ~~sterling~~ one third part is due and payable to the Revd  
John Drinkley as a Composition for the Tithes claimable by him as  
Rector of the said Parish and the remaining Two third parts thereof  
are due and Payable to the Revd Edward Mahon as Vicar and Owner  
of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish, And we further certify that  
the average price of oats being the Corn principally grown in such  
County for the Period of Seven Years ending on the first day of  
November 1821, is fourteen <sup>Shillings and British</sup> per Barrel.
