James Morrough & Rev. John Swynn, Clerke, both of the Town of Edilworth, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, entitled "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time: to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of Edilworth, in the County of Cork, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all the Impropriate Tithes of said Parish is One Hundred and Seventy Pounds British, by the year due and payable to the Impropriator

And we do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn principally grown in such County for the period of seven years, ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1821 is Fourteen Shillings and one Farthing British --- by the Board, dated this 11<sup>th</sup> day of August 1827.

At a Special Vestry duly held on the 20<sup>th</sup> day of August 1827 for the purpose of taking into consideration the above Certificate in and of Mount Ashell in the Town ---

Resolved that on behalf of the Tenants and Occupiers of Land in said Parish of Edilworth we assent and agree to the payment of the above mentioned Sum of One Hundred and Seventy Pounds British by the year as a Composition for the Impropriate Tithes of said Parish. And we further assent on behalf of such Tenants and Occupiers of Land that the said Composition shall be invariable for Twenty one years from the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November next, and shall continue to be levied without any Variation in amount whatever the price of Corn may be.
