the Town of Kilsnooth, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn
under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign
of King George the fourth, intituled an Act to provide for the
establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time
to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising
growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Kilsnooth in the
County of Dub., Do hereby certify that the true and just amount
of Composition for all the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish is one
Hundred and Seventy Pounds British by the year due and
payable to the Rev. Thomas Newham for the Tithes claimable
by him as Vicar of said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average price
of oats being the corn principally grown in such County, for the
year of seven years ending on the 1st day of November 1824 is
Twenty Shillings and one Farthing British by the Land.
