

Mr Pierce Blake of Hollyport and John Allman of Eyecourt Esqrs Commissioners  
duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act made in the 4<sup>th</sup> Year of the  
Reign of King George the fourth entitled an act for the Establishing of Compositions for  
tithes in Ireland for a Limited time to ascertain and fix a true and just composition  
for all tithes arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Stiltote in  
the County of Galway do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition  
for all tithes whatsover within the said Parish is Two hundred and twenty one Pounds twelve  
Shillings starting by the Year of which sum of Two hundred and twenty one Pounds twelve  
Shillings, one hundred and fifty six Pounds twelve Shillings are due and payable to Alexander  
Macaulay and his successors as a composition for the tithes claimable by him as Rector of  
said Parish, twenty five Pounds is due and payable to the Bishop of Clonfert and his successors five  
Pounds is payable to Thomas Hawkins as Dean of Clonfert and his successors, thirty five  
Pounds starting are due and payable to James Strange Hutson as Archdeacon of Clonfert  
and his successors - We do further certify that the average price of oats being the corn  
principally grown in such county for the period of seven Years ending the first  
day of November 1821 is ten Shillings and six pence by the Barrell, signed sealed  
and delivered this 26<sup>th</sup> day of October 1823
