

I John Tinton Sole Commissioner duly appointed and sworn, in and by virtue of an act made in the second and third years of the Reign of his present Majesty King William the 4th, entitled "an act to amend three acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the 4th, providing for the establishing of Composition for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Composition permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes, arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Killurra, in the Diocese of Achonry, and Counties of Sligo and Mayo, do hereby Certify, that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish, is Two hundred and twenty nine pounds thirteen Shillings and four pence halfpenny Sterling by the year, of which Sum of Two hundred and twenty nine pounds thirteen Shillings and four pence halfpenny, the Sum of One hundred and twenty pounds five Shillings and ten pence halfpenny, are due and payable to the Reverend John Garnett as a Composition for the Tithe claimable by him as Vicar, for the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish. — And that the Sum of One hundred and nine pounds seven Shillings and six pence Sterling is due and payable to Robert Baker Esq. for the Rectorial or Lay impropriate Tithes, as the Lessee of said Tithes under the Heirs, Assigns or Representatives of the late Sir Henry Montgomery Bart. deceased. —

And I do Certify, that the average price of Oats being the corn principally grown in the Counties of Sligo and Mayo, for the period of seven years ending on the first day of November One thousand eight hundred and thirty, is Thirteen Shillings and three pence three farthings Sterling by the Barrel — Given and Certified under my hand and seal at Ballymote this Seventeenth Day of June 1833
