Commissioners duly appointed and sworn,  
under and by virtue of an Act made in the  
fourth year of the Reign of King George the fourth  
(entitled an Act to provide for establishment of composition  
of Tithes for a limited Period) and amended by an  
Act made in the fifth year of the reign of the said King  
George Chap<sup>r</sup> 53 to ascertain and fix a true composition  
for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within  
the Parish of Kilcarrett in the County of Sligo:

Do hereby certify that the true and just amount  
of composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the  
Parish is Eighty three pounds by the year of which  
sum of Eighty three pounds the sum of thirty eight pounds  
are due and payable to the very Rev<sup>d</sup> Dean of Keshomony  
as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him  
as Rector of said Parish the said sum of thirty eight  
pounds being the moiety of the Tithes arising and  
payable by and out of the four following Town  
lands respectively in said Parish viz Claragh (except the subdenomination of Shanorontearne)  
Fimlough Rathgrau and Rathmew. And the
