

We John Inwon and Chad R O'Hara commissioners duly
appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in
the fourth year of the reign of King George the fourth -
entitled an Act to provide for the establishing of composition
for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time - to ascertain and
fix a true and just composition for all Tithes arising, growing,
yielded, or payable within the Parish of Kilbarnet in the
County of Sligo, do hereby certify that the true and just amount
of composition for all Tithes whatsoever within the said Parish
is eighty eight pounds by the year, of which Sum of eighty
eight Pounds, forty pounds ten Shillings are due and payable
to the Dean of Achonry, as composition for the Tithes claimable
by him as Rector of the said Parish, and the Sum of Forty Seven
Pounds ten Shillings is due and payable to Archdeacon Joseph
Peschayle the Vicar of the said Parish

And we do further certify that the average Price of oats
being the Corn principally grown in such County for the Period
of seven years ending on the 1st Day of November 1841, are
is fifteen Shillings and two pence $\frac{1}{4}$ per Barrel
