Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a limited time: according
to the directions of the said Act, and according to equity and
good conscience, and without favour or affection, prejudice or
malice, to any person or persons whomsoever, so help me God:

growing, yielded, or payable within the Parish of *Kilvine*
in the County of Mayo, do hereby certify, that the true and
just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within
the said Parish is one hundred and twenty six pounds ten
shillings Sterling by the year, which sum is payable to the
Reverend *Thomas Coffey*, as a composition for the Tithes claim-
able by him as Rector of the said Parish
