

Ballyhooby 24<sup>th</sup> Sept 1833

I James Fraser Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an act passed in the 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> years of the reign of his present Majesty King William the fourth entitled "an act to amend the laws relating to the fourth, fifth, and in the seventh and eighth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth, providing for the establishment of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true <sup>and</sup> just composition for all Tithes arising, yielding, growing, or payable within the parish of Ballyhooby and County of Cork, do hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the said parish is ~~four hundred and sixty eight pounds~~ by the year the whole of which is truly due and payable to the Rev<sup>d</sup> William Butler as a composition for the Tithes claimed by him as Rector of said parish.

And I do further certify that the average price of Wheat being the corn principally grown in said parish for the period of seven years ending the 1<sup>st</sup> of November 1830 is ~~no ground~~ ~~valued~~ ~~at~~ ~~the~~ ~~rate~~ ~~of~~ ~~half~~ ~~penny~~ ~~per~~ ~~barrel~~
