



We James Crosbie & Pierce Crosbie, both of Bally-

for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland for a  
limited time" - to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition  
for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the  
Parish of Ballysheige in the County of Kerry, do hereby certify  
that the true & just amount of Composition for all Tithes  
whenever within the said Parish is Three Hundred & fifty-  
seven Pounds Sterling by the year, which sum is due &  
payable to the Rev. James P. Chute, as Rector & Vicar of  
the said Parish. - And we do further certify that  
the average Price of Oats being the Corn principally grown  
in such County for the Period of Seven years ending on the  
31<sup>st</sup> day of October 1821 is near Shillings & Four pence per  
Bushel Given under our Hands & Seals this Twenty
