

Extracted from the Registry of the Honourable Court of Wexford

I Charles Patrick Macdonnell Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second and third years of the reign of King William the fourth entitled "an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively in the fourth fifth and sixth years of the reign of his late Majesty King George the fourth providing for the establishing of composition for tithes in Ireland and to make such composition permanent to ascertain and fix a true and just composition for all tithes arising growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Ballyharry the County of Cork do hereby certify that the true and just amount of composition for all tithes within the said Parish is four hundred pounds Sterling by the year which sum of four hundred pounds is due and payable to the said William Sumner Rector of the said Parish of Ballyharry as a composition of the tithes claimable by him. And I do further certify that the average price of wheat being the corn principally grown in said County for the period of seven years ending on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1830 is one pound twelve shillings and one half penny Sterling per barrel -
