I John Keid Commissioned, duly appointed & sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the second third year of the Reign of His Majesty King William the Fourth Intituled, "An Act to amend three Acts" "passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and in the Seventh & Eighth years of the Reign of His Majesty King George" "the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions" "for Tithes in Ireland" "to make such Compositions permanent" "(17 Aug 1832)" "to ascertain & fix a true & just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of Ballyfeard in the County of Cork, do hereby certify that the true & just amount of Composition for all

Total } Tithes whatever within the said Parish is Two Hundred & Thirty Pounds by the year, of which sum of Two Hundred

Vicarial } & Thirty Pounds, the sum of One Hundred & Thirty Pounds is due & payable to the Rev^d Nicholas Cole Bowen, as Vicar of said Parish, under, by virtue & according to the Terms of a Composition already entered into for same, as appears by Certificate dated 31st May 1827, and by corresponding Apptment both deposited in the Registry Office of the Diocese of Cork.

Impropriate } The remainder of said sum of Two Hundred and Thirty Pounds; that is, to say, the sum of One Hundred Pounds, is due & payable to Achilles Daunt Esq^r, under and by virtue of a Lease from Lord Viscount Shannon, Say Impropriator of the Vicarial Tithes of said Parish, said Lease bearing date the thirtieth of November 1809 for a term of Nine Hundred Ninety nine years from said date.

And I do further certify that the average price of wheat during the Seven years ended first November 1831 (thirty) was One Pound Twelve Shillings & One half penny per Barrel, that the price of Oats during said period was Twelve Shillings & Eleven pence half penny per Barrel; Wheat and Oats being the Corn principally grown in said County of Cork.
