I John Kidd, Commissioned, duly appointed
Sworn, under the virtue of an Act made in the second &
third years of the Reign of His Majesty King William the
Fourth Intituled "An Act to Amend Three Acts, passed"
"respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in the Seventh and"
"Eighth years of the Reign of His Majesty King George"
"the Fourth, providing for the establishing of Compositions"
"for Tithes in Ireland, and to make such Compositions"
"Permanent (16 Aug 1832)" to ascertain the true just Compo-
sition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within
the Parish of Ballyfeard in the County of Cork, do hereby
certify that the true & just Amount of Composition for all Tithes
whatev^r within the said Parish is Two Hundred & Thirty Pounds
Sterling by the year - Of which sum of Two Hundred and Thirty
Pounds, the sum of One Hundred & Thirty Pounds, is due and
payable to the Rev^d Nealy Cole Bowen as Vicar of said Parish,
under, by virtue & according to the terms of a Composition already
entered into for same, as appears by certificate dated 31 May 1832
& corresponding appointment, both deposited in the Registry Office
of the Diocese of Cork. The remainder of the said sum of
Two Hundred & Thirty Pounds, that is to say, the sum of
One Hundred Pounds is due and payable to Achilles Daulton
Esq; under the virtue of a Lease from Lord Viscount Shannon
the Lay Impropriator, bearing date the Thirtieth day of
Nov^r 1809 for a term of Nine Hundred & Ninety Nine years
from the date of said Lease.

And I do further certify that the average price of
wheat during the Seven years ended first Nov^r 1830 (that is to say,
One Pound Twelve Shillings & One half penny) per Barrel, &
that the price of Oats during same period was Twelve
Shillings & Eleven Pence Half penny per Barrel; wheat and
Oats being the Corn principally grown in said County
of Cork.
