and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of
the Reign of King George the Fourth entitled An Act
to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes
in Ireland for a limited time to ascertain and fix a
true and just Composition for all Tithes arising
paying Yields or payable within the Parish of
Cathinduggan in the County of Cork

Do hereby certify that the true and just
amount of Composition for all Tithes whatever
within that part of said Parish consisting of the
several Denominations of Lands herein after mentioned
that is to say The Ploughlands of Ballytrack —
Ballymee, Ballymague, Ballidaniel East, Balli-
daniel West, Cathinduggan, Cahirciveen, Glengiven —
Croughasserry, Keelmacoombe, Kilburren, Feig, and
Tropothouse, is Two Hundred and Eighty Pounds
by the Year and which sum of Two Hundred and
Eighty Pounds by the Year is due and payable to
Charles Denham Orlando Johnson Esq^r as a Composition
for the Tithes claimable by him out of said mentioned
lands as Feig Proprietor of the said Parish

And we do further certify that the
average Price of Oats being the Corn principally
grown in the County of Cork for the period of
seven Years ending on the 1st of November 1821 is
Fourteen Shillings per barrel
