

I^r John Mahony Commissioner duly appointed and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of King William the Fourth intituled "An Act to amend Three Acts passed respectively in the Fourth, Fifth and in the Seventh and Eighth Years of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth providing for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland and to make such Compositions permanent" to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for All the Rectorial ^{Tithes} arising growing yielded or payable within the Parish of Banaway in the County of Cork and which said Rectorial Tithes consist of a moiety of the whole Tithes of that portion of the said Parish of Banaway comprising the Townlands of Bawnbridge, Coolnacorrig, Goodrum, Coolnassoon, Clasper, Kilanardish, Lehana, and Monagle. Duly hereby certify that the true and just amount of Composition for all the Rectorial Tithes, whatever within the said Parish as aforesaid is Fifty Five Pounds by the Year and which sum of Fifty Five Pounds by the Year is due and payable to the Reverend Archdeacon Lawrence as a Composition for the Tithes claimed by him as the Rector of the said Parish.

And I further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in the County of Cork for the period of the seven successive years preceding the first day of November One Thousand Eight Hundred and Thirty is Thirteen Shillings and Two pence and the one seventh of a penny per barrel.
