

We, Owen Madden and John Mahony
Commissioners duly appointed and sworn under
and by virtue of an Act made in the Fourth Year of the
Reign of King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act
to provide for the establishing of Compositions for
Tithes in Ireland for a limited time" to ascertain
and fix a true and just composition for all Tithes
arising, growing, yielded or payable within the
Parish of Carrigloamleary in the County of Cork

Anctherby certify that the true and just amount
of Composition for all Tithes whatever within the
said Parish is Two Hundred and Seventy Pounds
by the year of which sum of Two Hundred and
Seventy Pounds One moiety or half part is due
and payable to the Reverend John Bagwell Braugh
as a composition for the Tithes claimable by him
as the Vicar of the said Parish and one moiety
or half part of said annual sum of Two Hundred
and Seventy Pounds is due and payable to
John Corr Esq: as a composition for the Tithes
claimable by him as owner of the Peculiar Tithes
of said Parish.

And we do further certify that the average
price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in the
County of Cork for the period of seven years ending
on the first day of November 1821 is Fourteen Shillings
per Barrel
