(Agent to the Vicar the Rev. HORACE TOWNSEND,) MICHAEL ROBERTS, Esq., Lay Impropriator, and John Drew Atkin, Esq. (Agent to THOMAS WADE FOOT, Esq., Lay Impropriator,) effered to take as Composition for all said Tithes, at a Special Vestry of the Parish held on the 23d of September, 1833—of which Sum of £260, one half part is due and payable to the Rev. Horace Townsend as Vicar of said Parish—one fourth part is due and payable to Michael Roberts, Esq. as Lay Impropriator—and the other one fourth part is due and payable to Thomas Wade Foot, esq. as Lay Impropriator. AND I do further Certify, that the average Price of Wheat, being the Corn principally grown in said County, for the period of Seven Years, ending on the 1st of November, 1830, is One Pound Twelve Shillings and One Halfpenny British, as published in the Dublin Gazette.
