By the Justices assigned
to keep the peace in and
for the County of Cork at
a General Quarter Sessions
held at Bantry in the
Division of Bantry in Cork
County West Riding on
the 9th day of July 1867

Whereas due notice
having been first affixed
at the times and in the
manner directed by the

Statutes in such case made and provided by George Robinson
John William Clarke and Joseph Edward Tracy three Owners
of land in the Parish of Drimoleague in the Division of Bantry
and Cork County West Riding, each charged with the Annual
Payment of the sum of £3 and upwards in respect of the
Rent Charge payable in lieu of the Composition for Tithes
within said Parish made by the Certificate of Abraham Jago
and Thomas Evans, bearing date the 20th day of Feb 1826
in pursuance of the Statutes in such case made and provided
and whereby the Gross Amount of Composition for all tithes
whatever in said Parish was certified to be the Annual sum
of £450. they the said three owners of land made application
in writing to the Justices of the Peace at the Quarter Sessions
above mentioned to have the average price of Wheat being the
Grain in said Certificate mentioned for the seven years last
preceding inquired of and ascertained in order that the said
Composition for Tithes in said Parish, and the Tithes Rent Charge
payable in lieu thereof might be diminished in proportion.
