

The 2nd 1834

Thomas Fitzgerald Commissioner duly appointed
and sworn under and by virtue of an Act made in the second
and third year of the reign of King William the fourth
entitled an Act to amend three Acts passed respectively
in the fourth fifth and in the seventh and eighth years
of the reign of our late Majesty King George the fourth
providing for the Establishing of Composition for
Tithes in Ireland. and to make such Composition perma-
nent to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition
for all Tithes arising growing yielded or payable within
the Parish of Dunmore in the County of Wick
Certify that the true and just amount of Composition
for all Tithes whatever within the said Parish is One Hundred
and Seventy five pounds three shillings by the year
of which Sum of One Hundred and Seventy five Pounds
three shillings the Sum of Eighty five pounds three
shillings is due and payable to the Marquess of Ormond
as Composition for the Rectorial Tithes and Ninety pounds
of said One Hundred and seventy five pounds three shillings
is due and payable to the Rev. James Moleworth Parson
as Vicar thereof. And I do further certify that the Average price
of wheat being the Corn principally grown in such County for
the period of seven years ending on the first day of November
Eighteen hundred and thirty is thirty two shillings and one penny
per Barrel. Given under my hand this 27th day of July 1834
