We, John Power and Nicholas Mahon James, Commissioners duly appointed and sworn, under and by virtue of an Act made in the fourth year of the reign of King George the Fourth, entitled, "An Act to provide for the establishing of Compositions for Tithes in Ireland," for a limited time, to ascertain and fix a true and just Composition for all Tithes arising, growing, yielded or payable within the Parish of ~~Dysart~~ in the Diocese of Lismore, and County of Waterford, do hereby certify that the true and just amount, of Composition for all Tithes whatever, within the said Parish, is *Three hundred and four Pounds Twelve Shillings and three pence three farthings* Sterling per Annum. *one hundred and one pounds ten shillings and three pence farthings* whereof is payable to the Vicar and *two hundred and three Pounds one Shilling and six pence half penny* is payable to the Rector of *1st Parish* as and for their respective Vicar and Rectorial proportions of Tithes for said Parish and a necessary to our *Beneficiaries of Amount of Composition* The present Vicar being *The Rev^d Par^{is} Dredshaw and The Rev^d Nicholas Herbert Rector*

And we do further certify that the average price of Oats, being the Corn principally grown in said County and Parish, for the period of seven years, ending on the 1st day of November, 1821, is Fourteen Shillings & one Farthing per Barrel.
